Our Canopy Project which will extend the verandah outside all three classrooms by approx. 3 metres has been approved and the behind the scenes consent process is underway. We are also completing MOE paperwork to begin a Solar Panel Project which will see our school taking one big step in reducing our carbon footprint and saving some big \$\$ along the way!

BREAKFAST IN SCHOOLS

Next term we have been invited to become part of the Breakfast in Schools Project which will provide Weetbix for breakfast for any of children who would like it. Once product has arrived we will start with two mornings a week and may extend this if needed.
