- Native plants or grasses.
- Treated timber various sizes 1 metre+ in length.
- Tree stumps/rounds suitable for stepping stones or seats (macrocarpa?).
- Copper wire (any size or amount).
- Ponga logs

MAC clubs are working on art features such as fairy doors, wind chimes, tin can insects, bird feeders, rock art and bug hotels to adorn the space. We look forward to Matariki celebrations being a time for whanau to contribute to Te Wā. Later in the term we hope to host a working bee for those of you keen to assist with planting and other jobs.
