And of course Rochelle Cleary, rochelle@arapohue.school.nz will be in the office 8 – 1 daily and will be available to answer all of your questions!




ENVIRO SCHOOLS

STATIONERY

This year our stationery packs will cost \$25 for each student. All students will be issued with the required stationery and we ask that you make payments to the school to cover costs as soon as you are able. Please contact Rochelle in the office if you would like to start weekly payments, our school account number is **School Bank a/c 12-3098-0257114-00.** Please ensure to include your childs name and 'stationery' in the reference.

If you do NOT want school to provide your stationery and would prefer to purchase your own from an alternative supplier please contact Rochelle before 1 Feb and she will provide you with a class list.

As we have opted into the MOE donations scheme there are no school fees required. All children who have paid in full by the end of the month will go into a draw to win their \$25 back!

SWIMMING

We will begin swimming from day one so please ensure your children come prepared. Swimming is a core part of our curriculum and all students are expected to participate. Please send togs AND a towel in a bag each day with your child, or a note to their teacher if they are unable to swim for any reason.

BUSES - NEW TICKET SYSTEM

There have been some changes with Ritchies for those children who pay to use the bus. See info below:

Ineligible Students

As you are aware, this Company brings to your School on a daily basis, students who are termed "Ineligibles":- a Ministry of Education definition.

The Ministry has directed that all Ineligible Students pay a Bus Fare and as such the amount of \$135:00 (One Hundred and Thirty Five Dollars) per student per term.

In years past the current system of collecting these payments has been both time consuming and ineffective, resulting in a high number of ineligible students being carried without a fare of any kind being paid.

Therefore, to tidy up this situation, we are changing to a "Ticket" system commencing from Term 1 of the 2023 School Year. A Concession Ticket for the applicable Term will be issued to the student when the Term fare is paid in full.

Our drivers will be requesting to sight these tickets from Monday 13th February 2023 and ineligible students without the necessary ticket may not be allowed to travel on School Buses until they have one. Tickets will be issued from our Depot in Beach Road, Dargaville.

Parents of ineligible students attending your school this year will be notified of this new system in adequate time to enable this change to be implemented.
