CYBER SAFETY PRESENTATION

We want our school to be a safe place. Because of the rapidly changing times, our tamariki are growing up in, and the mounting challenges and harms they are facing online we need to start talking about and tackling this as a community.

As such, our Kāhui Ako have organised Filmmaker, Author and Speaker Rob Cope, producer of the documentary "Our Kids Online" to come and give what promises to be a humorous and eye-opening evening talk to our parent community.

His talk will cover

- Cyberbullying How bullies can reach our kids 24/7
- **Social media** How social media is affecting the mental health in 3 out of 5 children. FOMO, depression, anxiety.
- Gaming and the developing brain An oversupply of dopamine leading to dopamine deficiency, synaptic pruning, and the underdevelopment of social skills and empathy
- Naked Selfies The pressure to send nudes from intermediate up through high school
- Online predators The methods they use, how to spot them.
- Online porn vs healthy sexuality How consuming online pornography as a child or teen can create a sexual template where violence, aggression, and dominance are seen as normal and consent can become very blurry

Solutions

- Filters Which filters are best and how to install them
- Smartphones How to lock down a smartphone to make it a safe phone
- Boundaries How to put good boundaries in place around device use
- 3 golden rules The 3 golden rules that will keep your kids safe
- Talking to your kids How to have difficult conversations with your kids
- Challenging our own phone and device usage Reconnecting as a family.

The talk will be held in Dargaville High School hall on Wednesday 14th Feb at 6:30pm We would request that at least one adult from each family attend, this topic is too big for us not to pay attention.

ATTENDANCE

Student attendance, along with effective teaching, has the greatest influence on student engagement and achievement. All students must be present at school so they can participate and engage in learning. Parents and Boards are legally responsible to ensure students' regular attendance at school. Students with high absenteeism are less likely to succeed in their learning. If a student misses five school days each term, or one day a fortnight, they will miss the equivalent of one year of school over 10 years. As the level of absenteeism grows, the difficulty of re-engaging in learning can grow exponentially.

Justified absences are situations such as your child is sick, attending a medical or dental appointment, funeral or tangi. This needs to be communicated to the office to ensure it is recorded correctly. Unjustified absences are situations such as holidays during term time, shopping trips, or lack of interest/motivation!

While unjustified absences have increased dramatically across the country, here at Arapohue our data looks quite positive and is definitely above the norm for Northland. Last year in Term 1 we had 91% attendance (approx. 25% higher than the Tai Tokerau average!) Our goal this year will be to hit above the **90% mark EVERY term**. You can help us by ensuring that, assuming your child is healthy, they are at school! If they are not attending PLEASE communicate with the office asap.

Thanks to some funding from the MoE there will be some additional acknowledgements for students who are meeting these targets.

NEW STUDENTS

We already have 3 new students enrolled to start next week, if you have any new neighbours, family or friends that have children likely to start this term, please encourage them to email or call me to complete enrolment paperwork so we can plan accordingly. We will start our school term with a Mihi Whakatau, welcoming these new students and their whānau. Feel free to join us at 8:30 on Wednesday 31 Jan.

STATIONERY

This year our stationery packs will cost approximately \$25 for each student. (Rochelle will confirm this next week!) All students will be issued with the required stationery and we ask that you make payments to the school to cover costs as soon as you are able. Please contact Rochelle if you would like to start weekly payments, our school account number is **School Bank a/c 12-3098-0257114-00**. Please be sure to include your childs name and 'stationery' in the reference.

If you do NOT want school to provide your stationery and would prefer to purchase your own from an alternative supplier please contact Rochelle before 31 Jan and she will provide you with a class list.

As we have opted into the MOE donations scheme there are no school fees required.

All children who have paid in full by the end of the month will go into a draw to win their \$25 back!

SWIMMING

We will begin swimming from day one so please ensure your children come prepared. Swimming is a core part of our curriculum and **ALL** students are expected to participate. Please send togs AND a towel in a bag each day with your child, or a note to their teacher if they are unable to swim for any reason.



A reminder that students need TOGS to swim in - not their

clothes and long hair needs to be tied up.
