




Congratulations to Phoenix who was our first student to win 25 PATH cards – he chose a dip in the treasure chest!

Our Kāhui Ako is made up of the following schools and Early Learning Centres - Arapohue School, Dargaville High School, Dargaville Primary School, Dargaville Intermediate School, Ruawai Primary School, Kaihu Valley School, Matakohe School, Pouto School, Tangowahine School, Te Kopuru School, Tinopai School and Aranga Puna, Dargaville, Ruawai and Selwyn Park Kindergartens, Dargaville, Mamaranu and Te Kopuru Playcentres.

Our Kāhui also employs an Across Schools Teacher, Anne Heappey, who is based at DPS but spends two days a week working on Kāhui Ako projects.

We also provide 8 Within School Teachers who provide additional support in both their own schools as well as others in the Kāhui.

We would like to thank those of you who were able to attend the Kids Online presentation which was held last week. It was very confronting at times but by the end of the night we all left loaded with ideas and strategies to help guide our children safely through the digital online world.

Our schools and centres work collaboratively together to achieve our vision, "Proud and engaged learners through a culture of care" Given the geographical distances between our schools a major focus is on building relationships to mitigate isolation and provide support for

students, staff and school leaders to ensure better outcomes for learners and smoother transitions between schools in the Northern Wairoa area.

We have three priorities for this year;

- 1. We are continuing with the Writers Toolbox professional development. The feedback that we have received so far from our teachers and tamariki has been very positive. Our goal is to raise the writing achievement of our learners through teacher development and developing more consistent approaches and language between schools.
- 2. Develop authentic working relationships with local Iwi and Hapu.
- 3. Strengthening Educational Pathways or transitions between centres and schools. Here we will look at ensuring we provide multiple opportunities for our students and staff across the Kaipara to connect, learn, grow and have fun together. Please talk to your school principal if you have any questions or suggestions. We are really excited to see where 2024 takes us.


