NEWS FROM RĀKAU

Kia ora koutou,

Welcome to my first newsletter for Rākau! I can't believe we're already in Week 4—the term is flying by and we've already covered so much great learning. Here is a brief overview of our learning so far:

- **Maths:** We've been learning about measurement, decimals, and percentages, with a strong focus on improving our basic facts through daily practice.
- Reading: Students are reading a range of non-fiction texts to strengthen their fluency, accuracy, ability to identify main ideas, and comprehension.
- Writing: We're focusing on developing sentence structure, vocabulary, grammar, punctuation, and language features, a great way to reflect on our writing, give feedback, and learn from others.
- **Spelling:** Each day we use the *STEPS* Web programme, where students complete activities to build spelling confidence and work towards a weekly goal.
- **Inquiry**: Our topic is centred on the not-so-good side of sustainability, exploring the negative impacts people have on the environment. It has sparked some really thoughtful conversations.
- Science: We've explored the "What's the Buzz?" science kit, learning about bumblebees and their important role in our ecosystem.
- Leadership: Students are learning about leadership, what it means to be a good leader and the skills involved. Students have been exploring different leadership roles and discussing ways they can demonstrate leadership within the school. Mrs Piper has been guiding them through this with some great discussions and activities.
- Fitness: We are training daily for cross-country to build stamina and improve our overall fitness.
- **Technology**: Each week students travel to the Intermediate School for technology lessons, where this term's focus is on sewing skills—students are currently designing and making their own cushions.
