a peacock.



#### **NEWS FROM MĀHURI**

As week six draws to a close, the students of Māhuri move from the fraction work and into Geometry – classifying 2d and 3d shapes. We began by having some fun with shapes.









Māhuri students are enjoying both the dance and percussion music we have been experimenting with – learning to move to a beat and synchronise with others. Three teams will attend the NW Dance Competition in week 8. Some of the students are also looking forward to presenting their speeches next week in front of the school. #### **NEWS FROM RĀKAU**

It has been a busy and exciting few weeks in Rākau! The students have been diving into science experiments,

preparing their persuasive speeches, and exploring the arts through digital music.

Here's a little look at what we've been up to:



#### Science: Magnetic Madness

For the past two weeks, our focus in science has been the Magnetic Madness kits. The students loved experimenting with magnets and discovering how they work.

#### We explored:

- How magnets attract or repel different materials.
- The mystery of the north and south poles and how they interact.
- Making our very own compasses, learning how magnetism helps us find direction.

It has been wonderful seeing the students' curiosity come alive as they tested, predicted, and shared their ideas with each other.





#### **Writing: Persuasive Speeches**

Our writing programme has been buzzing with ideas as everyone works on their persuasive speech topics. Students have been learning how to:

- Research their ideas and back them up with facts.
- Use persuasive language to capture an audience's attention.
- Speak confidently in front of others.

This week, they will be presenting their speeches to the whole school. They should be proud of the effort they've put in.



#### The Arts: Digital Music Exploration

This term our Arts focus has been on music, with a modern twist — using Chrome Music Lab to create and experiment. Students have been busy:

- Recreating familiar songs using digital tools.
- Playing with rhythm, melody, and harmony.
- Composing their own original pieces of music.

It has been fantastic to see their creativity shine through, with plenty of laughter and excitement as they test out sounds and share their music with their peers.


